- Take part in a 30-hour Gmul Hishtalmut with a grade for assignments (2 completed teaching activities and reflection).
- Participate in two days of educator workshops on key negotiation concepts and tools and for working together on classroom/curriculum application and lesson plan creation (Dates TBD).
- Work with PATHWAYS and other Fellows to create and share teaching activities to explore and reinforce principled negotiation ideas, skills, and values via English Language curriculum.
- Take part in three webinars with international negotiation experts.
- Attend a closing event for Fellows to share and celebrate created teaching activities.
- Select a group of motivated and committed students with 5 point English levels for a two-day Game Changers student workshop. Host a day of my two-day student workshop led by PATHWAYS facilitators: one day will be held at each school in a pair (November - March). The workshop will bring students together, both boys and girls, from different cultures and communities in order to build their negotiation and problem-solving skills and to promote inter-cultural exchange and understanding.
- Actively observe student workshop in order to consider ways to bring to life in classroom.

- Arrange and pay for a bus on the day my school visits the partner school for the student workshop.
- Arrange and pay for snacks, drinks and lunch on the day on which my school hosts the other school (taking into consideration potential dietary needs of students in coordination with partner school).
- Arrange my own transportation to teacher events and workshops.
- Conduct post workshop reflection, reinforcement & application with students.
